7. <u>SELECTION PROCEDURE</u>

The selection procedure will be held in two phases which are as under:-

(a) Phase-I

(i) Written Examination

(b) Phase-II

- (i) Documentation
- (ii) Physical Measurement
- (iii) Physical Efficiency Test
- (iv) Trade Test
- (v) Medical Examination.

(a) First Phase

(i) Written Examination

The written examination will be conducted at the selected centres on the date and time fixed by HQ DG BSF, which will be communicated to all candidates through call letters by respective RAs as well as through BSF website. Admission in Written Examination Hall will be purely on production of Call Letter/Admit Card dispatched to the eligible candidates from respective RAs. Question papers will be printed in bilingual i.e. in Hindi & English both. There will be one composite paper of objective type with multiple choices to be answered on an OMR Answer Sheet. The written examination question paper will be consisting of following subjects:-

QUALIFYING MARKS FOR WRITTEN EXAMINATION

The qualifying marks of Candidates for Written Examination are as follows:-

(a) Candidates of Gen/OBC/EWS

=35%

(b) Candidates of SC/ST

= 33%

However, number of written qualified candidates to be called for 2nd Phase Examination i.e Documentation, PST/PET, Trade test and Medical Examination may be restricted to the five (05) times the number of vacancies advertised or number of candidates qualified in Written Examination whichever is lesser. There will be no re-evaluation of OMR Answer Sheets.

Note:-I Relaxation of respective category will only be given to those cases where vacancies are available in the respective category for the applied post/trade. If vacancies of the respective category are not available in the post/trade and candidate is not taking relaxation of his category, he will be treated as "Unreserved Category" candidate. If the vacancies of reserved category are not available in the respective category of the post/trade and reserved category candidate does not fulfill the criteria of Unreserved Category candidate, candidature of those candidates will be rejected at any stage.

Note:-II Candidates are not permitted to use Mobile Phone, Calculator or any other electronic/electrical device for answering any paper (Test Booklets). Candidates must not, therefore, bring Mobile Phone, Calculator or any other electronic/electrical device inside the Examination premises. Possession of these items, whether in use or not, will be considered as "use of unfair means" in the Examination and appropriate action will be taken by the department against such candidates, as per extant policy of the department.

<u>Note:-III</u> Discrepancies in Question Paper, if any, may be brought to the notice of the selection board in writing immediately on completion of holding the examination. Representation submitted subsequently will not be considered.

Note-IV The Written Examination will be conducted on OMR based answer sheet. If the candidate did not shade/wrongly shaded/did not fill/wrongly filled his mandatory data ovals i.e. Roll number, question booklet series code and category etc in the OMR Answer Sheet, the OMR Answer Sheet will be rejected at the initial stage and the OMR Answer Sheet will not be further evaluated for which candidates himself will be responsible for such rejection.

Stages of Second Phase Examaination will be as follows:-

(i) **Documentation**

Candidates will have to produce original copies of all the documents to testify their eligibility for the post on account of Age, Education, Technical Qualification, Experience, caste, relaxation for PST etc.

(ii) Physical Standard Test (PST)

Physical measurement will be carried out by the selection Board to assess the height, weight and chest of candidates according to the prescribed physical standard as mentioned in Para above.

(iii) Physical Efficiency Test (PET)

Candidates are required to qualify following events:-

- (a) 1 Mile Race 08 Minutes
- (b) High Jump 3 Feet 06 Inches (03 attempts)
- (c) Long Jump 11 Feets (03 attempts)

Note:-I All Ex-Servicemen are not required to undergo Physical Efficiency Test (PET). Ex-Servicemen are required to fulfill the Physical Standard Test (PST) prescribed for the concerned posts. However, all Ex-Servicemen are required to pass the Written Examination, Documentation, Trade Test and Medical Examination.

<u>Note:-II</u> Use of performance enhancing drugs in PET, be treated as disqualification.

(iv) Trade Test

Trade Test for each post will be carried out by the selection Board to assess the knowledge and experience of candidate in the respective technical field or trade applied by the candidate. Swimming Test for the post of CT (Crew) will also be carried out by the Selection Board.

(v) Medical Examination

Candidates who qualify all the above stages i.e. Written Examination, Documentation, PST/PET & Trade Test will undergo detailed Medical Examination, which will be carried out by detailed Medical Officer to assess their medical fitness. If found Unfit in the Medical Examination, they may prefer an appeal for Review Medical Examination within the prescribed time limit of 15 days. The provision for appeal for Review Medical Examination is only against an error of judgment of the Medical Examination Board. On acceptance of the appeal Review Medical Examination will be conducted and the decision of Review Medical Board will be final and no appeal/representation against the decision of the Review Medical Board will be entertained. The Medical Standards will be followed as provided in Guidelines for Recruitment Medical Examination in CAPFs & AR issued by Pers-II, Police-II Division, MHA (GOI) on 20th May 2015.

- (b) The candidate must not have knock knee, flat foot, varicose vein or squint in eyes, must possess CP III BY ISIHARA vision and must be in good mental and bodily health and free from any physical defect likely to interfere with the efficient performance of his duties.
- (c) Regarding tattoos on various part of body:-
 - (i) <u>Content</u>: Being a secular country, the religious sentiments of our countrymen are to be respected and thus, tattoos depicting religious symbol or figures and the name, as followed in India are to be permitted.
 - (ii) <u>Location</u>: Tattoos marked on traditional sites of the body like inner aspect of forearm but only left forearm, being non saluting limb or dorsum of the hands are to be allowed.
 - (iii) <u>Size</u>: Size must be less than ¼ of the particular part (Elbow or Hand) of the body.
- (d) Candidates will be allowed to appear for next event only after qualifying the previous event.
